Activities




Develop information standards on a priority basis

Ensure information standards support acceleration of integrated health and social care

Make standards easier to understand, assure, endorse, implement and use

Publish simple PRSB guidance on how to use information standards.

Outcomes

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- ✓ Standards address the highest priority needs (greatest impact to greatest number) and are widely supported
 - ✓ PRSB standards are useful, usable and used, reduce burden and risk and improve efficiency
 - ✓ Standards development becomes business as usual to deliver health and social care transformation.

Support and enable widespread use of information standards

Activities



Grow our Standards Partnership Scheme for suppliers and increase the number of suppliers assessed and supported to comply with standards

Build an evidence base of the benefits of information standards that drives their use

Provide adoption support for key standards: Shared care records, Transfers of care, Personalised care and support plan and social care

Plan and launch an equivalent Standards Partnership Scheme for care providers and integrated care systems.

Outcomes

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- ✓ Increased numbers of supplier partners and increased number achieving conformance for information standards; the quality mark is widely recognised and respected
 - ✓ Evidence of progressive, successful interoperability including shared care records
 - ✓ Key standards are in widespread use leading to reduced burden on workforce and benefits to care.

Support people to participate in their health and care through better shared care records

Activities



Develop, diversify and grow our people network to ensure people's views are well represented as we develop information standards

Produce useful guidance for professionals and people on how apps and digital technologies are assessed and can be used in care

Campaign for professionals and industry to promote adoption of 'About Me' and personalised care and support plans.

Outcomes



- ✓ PRSB is recognised as a strong advocate for people in standards and digital
- ✓ Personalised care is advanced through use of 'About Me' and integrated care plans
- ✓ Confidence and use of apps for self management increases with public and professionals
- ✓ Meaningful shared care records are increasingly available across health and social care.

Activities




Develop and increase the number of clinical and professional advocates who support us to develop and maintain information standards
